



South Australian Legislative Tracking (SALT) search guide

What is SALT?

The South Australian Legislative Tracking (SALT) system provides information on the progress and outcome of all Bills and motions introduced in both Houses of the South Australian Parliament. SALT is updated in real-time by the Clerks during a parliamentary sitting day.

You can check SALT to find:

- When a Bill or motion was introduced;
- Which Members spoke to the Bill or motion;
- The status or outcome of a Bill or motion; and
- A link to the second reading speech and explanation of clauses for each Bill.

How do I find a Bill or motion?

You can search using the Basic or Advanced search function.

The **Basic search** enables you to search by keyword (including title, Member name).

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The **Advanced search** enables you to search by title, date, Bill type, motion type, House (either House of Assembly or Legislative Council), or Member/Minister who introduced or spoke to the Bill or motion.

The default search function is for the current Session of Parliament. For earlier Sessions, select from the Parliament/Session drop-down menu, or enter specific dates.

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How do I check where a Bill or motion is up to?

The ‘status’ field indicates the stage the Bill or motion has reached.

For Bills (introduced in both Houses) the most common outcomes are:

- **Assented** – Bill has passed both Houses, been assented to and become law
- **1st Reading** – Bill has passed one House and been sent to the other, but no debate has yet taken place
- **Adj 2nd reading** – Debate on the Bill has been adjourned at the ‘second reading’ stage.

- **Agreed** – motion has passed.
- **Negatived** – motion has not passed.
- **Adjourned** – debate has been adjourned to a future date.
