



## Retention of the Title 'Honourable' in relation to the Parliament of South Australia

In South Australia, the title 'Honourable' (commonly abbreviated to 'Hon' or 'The Hon') is entitled to be held by the following, whilst in office:

- Governor
- Members of Executive Council (ie. Premier and Ministers)
- Speaker of the House of Assembly
- Members of the Legislative Council (including President of the Legislative Council)
- Judges of the Supreme Court and of the Court of Appeal

Individuals who hold office as a Member of Executive Council, Speaker of the House of Assembly, President of the Legislative Council, and Member of the Legislative Council do not automatically retain the title when they cease to hold office.

Once an individual ceases to hold one of the aforementioned parliamentary offices, they may upon request apply for the retention of the title for life. Approval of the retention of the title is granted if the following criteria of minimum length of service has been met:

Leader of the Government (ie. Premier)	- One year
Member of Executive Council (ie. Minister)	- Three years
President	- Three years
Speaker	- Three years
Member of the Legislative Council	- Ten years

Subsequent to Royal Assent of the *Australia Act 1986 (Cth)*, the Governor has delegated authority from the Sovereign to grant approval for the retention of the title in cases that meet the above criteria. The Clerk of the Legislative Council or the Clerk of the House of Assembly (depending on which House the applicant served in) notifies the individual of their eligibility and seeks their consent. If the applicant consents, the Clerk then writes to the Premier, confirming that the applicant satisfies the aforementioned criteria and has consented to their application to retain the title. The Premier may then offer advice/recommend to the Governor on approving the retention of the title. Any approval is subsequently published in the [South Australian Government Gazette](#).

NB: There is provision for a combination of service to be judged as meeting the criteria for retention (eg. one year of service as Minister with an additional two years' service as Speaker will total the minimum three years' service required to retain the title in both cases).

For Members of the Commonwealth Parliament of Australia, those persons sworn in as a Member of the Federal Executive Council (ie. Prime Minister, Ministers, or Parliamentary Secretaries), retain the title 'Honourable' for life. It rests with the Governor-General to continue or terminate membership of the Executive Council and consequently the right to the title. With one exception, Ministers appointed to the Executive Council have not in the past had their appointment to the Council terminated upon termination of their commission and hence have retained the title 'Honourable' for life. For the Speaker of the House of Representatives, they may be granted the privilege to retain the title for life if they served in the office for three or more years. For the President of the Senate, the practice is that the title may be retained only if authorised by the monarch. The title was also granted to all those who served as a Member of the First Parliament (1901). *Vide House of Representatives Practice, 7th Edition, page 161; Odgers' Australian Senate Practice, 14th Edition, page 149.*
